Question: When is the reporting day for the elementary students meeting their teachers again?

Answer: The elementary will release the schedule for when and how students will be meeting their teachers closer to the start of school, which is September 3.

Question: If there are cameras in the classroom for synchronous learning, how will you ensure privacy for all the students?

Answer: It will be the same as before. Each classroom will have a private Zoom link that will only be shared with the students of that class.

Question: Will siblings in different grades have the same group A or B at the same day/time?

Answer: If we go to a hybrid model, our default will be for siblings to be on the same day. Parents may request to have siblings on different days.

Question: It was a bit unclear, Sounded like you said I pick up my primary age children after half day?

Answer: One idea being considered is if we offer classes on campus five days a week for the younger students, there would be an early dismissal for them around 2 or 2:30. The students would then have online activities in arts or French later in the day. They early dismissal would be to reduce the amount of time the students have to wear a mask and to give the teachers time for lesson planning.

Question: Did we address 2days on two days off campus? Say elementary Mon-Tues and Secondary Thurs-Fri and Wed on line for all...

Answer: We did consider a hybrid option of two consecutive days on campus, but felt it would be better if the students could see their teacher every other day.

Question: Will all the teachers be in Dakar? Or will some be teaching remotely?

Answer: At this point, we expect the majority of our teachers to be in Dakar. We are still working on getting our teachers who are European clearance to return to Dakar. In addition, one or two teachers will teach remotely due to health concerns.

Question: Will the school have enough Chromebooks for us to purchase?

Answer: The school will have 20 Chromebooks for purchase for students in grade 3 and below.

Question: Does the Senegalese state allow the school openings in Senegal?

Answer: We believe this is the case based on the guidelines they have released and the fact that some of the grades in the Senegalese schools have been going to class for over a month now. Most of the private, international schools in the city are planning on opening around the same time as ISD.
